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Welcome to Orange Grove’s new learning options! Our mission is to create curious, capable, and compassionate problem solvers. Beginning October 26, we are offering two learning options: In-Person Learning and Remote Learning. Please review our plan below, and select the option that is best for your student through our binding survey on ParentVUE. Selections must be made by 11:59 p.m. on October 14. Thank you for your partnership in this process.

When can my student transition to the other learning option?	After November 16, families who initially selected Remote Learning may apply to switch into the in-person setting. Each student’s schedule will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis; if there is capacity, they will be allowed to attend in-person. If capacity is exceeded for a student’s classes, they will be added to a wait list.

In-Person Learning Facts

Schedule
 All students will participate in synchronous lessons 4 days per week, following the bell schedule. During all synchronous days, one cohort will learn in-person, and one cohort will learn at home, remotely through CFSDConnect.

Programs or Classes Offered In-Person	All classes will be offered.

Classes Offered through CFSD Connect (livestream)	All classes will be livestreamed, with in-person students in the classroom and remote learning students connecting in from home.
If we select the In-Person Learning option, will my student's teachers change?	Because teaching assignments will shift during our transition to offering an in-person option, it is possible that your student's teachers may change. Additional changes may be required as circumstances and enrollment shift or change in the coming months. School personnel will take steps to ensure that these changes are kept to a minimum.
If one of my student's teachers changes, what will happen to my student's grades?	Grades will be documented on the report card. If a student changes teachers, the new teacher assignment and the grades earned by the student will be available through ParentVue for the second quarter.
What happens when the school's building capacity is reached?	If the initial demand for In-Person Learning exceeds capacity for the two cohort model, we will switch to a three-cohort model. If capacity is reached after In-Person Learning resumes (October 26), students will be placed on a wait list, and we will evaluate switching to a three-cohort model at the next grading period.

What happens if my student is put in quarantine?	Your student's teachers will support the student's learning during the absence by providing digital teaching and learning materials, as well as keeping them connected to lessons through livestreamed classes.
What if my student takes math at the high school?	Your student will attend synchronous, livestreamed lessons with the high school class through CFSD Connect. Your student will not travel to the high school, but will remain at Orange Grove Middle School, in a supervised and quiet space during their math class.
Will Choir, Band, Art and Orchestra be offered?	Yes, all classes are offered in our In-Person Learning option.
School Transportation	Bus service will be available for resident families who are eligible. Students must wear masks. Physical distancing will occur where possible.
In-Person Group Assignment	<p>Considerations for groupings will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Household members ● Class capacity ● Program constraints <p>Adjustments will be based on programming needs, not on personal preference.</p>
Remote Learning Facts	
Classes offered through CFSDConnect	All classes will be offered.
Remote Learning Environment	Teachers will utilize a camera and an integrated technology system that will enable all students to access the same lesson at the time the lesson is delivered.
Will any remote lessons be offered asynchronously?	Students in PE, Choir, and Band classes may have asynchronous lessons on some days when classes are held outdoors.

If my student stays in Remote Learning, will my student's teachers change?

Because teaching assignments will shift during our transition to offering an in-person option, it is possible that your student's teachers may change. Additional changes may be required as circumstances and enrollment shift or change in the coming months. School personnel will take steps to ensure that these changes are kept to a minimum.
