# Approval of Revisions to CFSD Performance Award Plan (second reading)

Executive Director of Curriculum and Assessment Sheryl Castro presented the second reading of CFSD's 2024-2025 Performance Award Plan. There were no recommended changes from the first reading on May 14,

2024. The proposed change applies to the minimum qualifying requirements for performance award eligibility, from the current minimum 135 teaching days to 162 days (or 90 percent of instructional days). The proposed change would align with current attendance expectations for students and improve the impact teachers make on student learning and academic achievement. Board members tabled the item and requested to review it with administration at the next regular meeting.

# Consideration of Revisions to Policy and Regulation JL, JL-R, Student Wellness (first reading)

Ms. Castro presented proposed revisions to the current policy and regulation which notes how often the District Wellness Committee meets. The current regulation states that the District Wellness Committee meets once a year. The proposed modification states the Committee will meet as often as necessary to establish goals for and oversee school health and safety policies and programs. The policy and regulation will return for the governing board's review at the next regular meeting on June 11, 2024.

#### FY 2025 Maintenance & Operation Budget

Ms. Castro highlighted changes to the proposed 2024-2025 Maintenance and Operations (M&O) budget since the previous board meeting on May 14, 2024. Changes to the expenditure budget include an increased cost for the substitute rate and for outsourced custodial services for the new strings building at Catalina Foothills High School. The budget will return to the agenda for review by the governing board at the next regular meeting.

#### 2024 Arizona Legislative / Governmental Activity

Board members discussed recent activity surrounding a lawsuit against the State of Arizona, alleging the state has failed to provide adequate funding for schools to maintain school buildings and facilities, thus impacting student learning and achievement.


